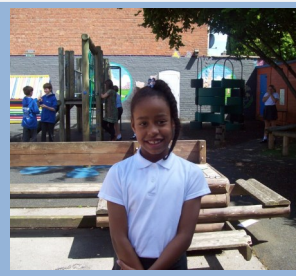
Class 1

Class 1 have journeyed to space, we have had fun learning about the moon and planets in our solar system. Year 1's have been very grown up researching facts and creating their own information sheets. In RE we have looked at the qualities needed to be a disciple and produced Wanted posters and we have worked on a variety of different numbers in Maths; missing numbers, counted, multiplied and divided!
